It uses advanced AI technology and large language models (LLMs) to provide a fluid and realistic listening experience. It's an essential tool for accessibility, helping people with dyslexia, visual impairments, or other reading difficulties. It's also very useful for students, professionals, and anyone who prefers to learn or consume content audibly. The free version offers basic features and a selection of voices, while paid versions unlock advanced features and a wider range of voices and uses (personal vs. commercial).

Key strengths:

- Converts text to speech with realistic, high-quality AI-powered voices.
- Supports over 100 languages and dialects, including multilingual voices that can automatically detect the language.
- Compatible with a wide range of file formats (PDF, DOCX, TXT, EPUB, PPTX, images, and more).

- Includes OCR (Optical Character Recognition) functions to read text from images and scanned documents.
- Offers a browser extension (Chrome) to read web content directly.
- Allows you to customize reading speed, pitch, and pronunciation with a pronunciation editor.
- Accessibility features like word highlighting, dark mode, and a dyslexia-friendly font.
- Cross-device synchronization (web app, mobile, and extension).
- Allows MP3 audio downloads for offline listening (with limits on free/basic plans).
- AI tools for text filtering (ignoring headers, footers, URLs) and a script assistant.

Limitations:

- The free version has limitations on access to premium/Plus voices, daily listening duration, and MP3 download capacity (generally limited to personal use and a character count).
- Some advanced features like voice cloning, commercial use of generated audio, or access to all LLM voices are reserved for paid plans.
- DRM-protected files (like some Kindle or iBooks) cannot be opened or read directly.
- The quality and naturalness of free voices are inferior compared to Premium or Plus voices.
- The user interface may appear a bit outdated or less intuitive in certain aspects for some users.
